INITIAL GRANTEES AWARDED FOR "2021 FUND FOR COVID SOLIDARITY"

The "2021 Fund for Covid Solidarity" has selected 13 organisations to support for a total of 600 000€.

The grantees were selected by a diverse and independent group of gender equality experts from women's funds, philanthropy, academia, CSOs and the private sector.ⁱ

Grantees come from 10 different countries (Croatia, Belgium, France, Hungary, Latvia, Italy, Spain, Greece, Czech Republic, Germany) with an equal distribution between Eastern, Southern and Northern Europe.

They work on issues such as violence against women, health and social protection (62%); access to economic resources, entrepreneurship and digital divide (23%); access to education and training (15%). They support a diversity of publics, mainly targeting women, girls and people living in the most vulnerable situations.

Our aim to support mainly front-line organisations resulted in 8 out of 10 of these grantees coming from CSOs with annual budget under 450 000€. In this context ¾ of these supported are dedicated gender organisations and those not solely focused on gender took a strong and sustainable gender approach.

The grants are awarded for a one-year period from January to December 2022 and provide either core support or project support.
